Did you know that during WW2, during 1942-1943, about 1,200 Indonesians, including women and children, were detained in Cowra, NSW? Unfortunately, many of them died unprepared for the Australian weather in June, marking winter's start.



Among the Indonesians buried in Cowra cemetery are political prisoners of the Dutch colonial government exiled to Boven Digul, Papua, in the 1920-1930s.
